Quality of delivery has improved. As a result, pupils are being challenged more effectively in PE lessons, progress amongst pupils in greater and attainment has increased. Children’s willingness and enthusiasm to participate in school sport has increased as a result of this. - Subject Leader knowledge and expertise has increased and their ability to lead their subject has improved. Equipment has been enhanced to allow teachers to deliver the PE curriculum more effectively. This has enabled pupils to receive a wider range of activities during the academic year.
